Definitions

1. In these regulations “the Regulations” means the Road Traffic and Transport Regulations published under Government Notice No. 53 of 30 March 2001 as amended by Government Notices Nos. 97 of 29 May 2001, 222 of 8 November 2001, 103 of 1 July 2002, 161 of 26 September 2002, 163 of 26 September 2002, 205 of 28 September 2004, 206 of 28 September 2004, 32 of 1 April 2005, 45 of 9 May 2005, 183 of 20 December 2005, 188 of 1 November 2006,

104 of 4 June 2007, 172 of 17 September 2007, 2 of 2 January 2008, 73 of 1 April 2008, 290 of 19 December 2008, 81 of 30 April 2010, 156 of 28 July 2015, 98 of May 2016, 86 of 13 April 2017, 130 of 29 June 2018, 31 of 15 February 2019, 102 of 3 April 2020 and 217 of 7 October 2021.

Amendment of regulation 118 of Regulations

2. Regulation 118 of the Regulations is amended in subregulation (2) by the substitution for subparagraph (i) of paragraph (c) of the following subparagraph:

“take imprints of the fingers starting with the left four fingers followed by the four right fingers and then the two thumbs together, and if the applicant has any missing finger, deselect the missing finger on the automated fingerprint recognition system;”.

Insertion of regulation 43A in Regulations

3. The Regulations are amended by the insertion after regulation 43 of the following regulation:

“Electronic renewal of motor vehicle licence

43A. (1) The renewal of a motor vehicle licence may be done electronically.

(2) For the purpose of the renewal referred to in subregulation (1), the owner must renew the licence by updating his or her details online by accessing the Namibia Traffic Information System through the Roads Authority website and that update serves as an application for the renewal referred to in subregulation (1).

(3) On completion of the process set out in subregulation (2), the owner must pay in the manner provided for on the Roads Authority website -

- (a) the appropriate motor vehicle licence fee imposed in terms of section of the Road Fund Administration Act, 1999 (Act No. 18 of 1999); and
- (b) if applicable, the penalties and arrear licence fees referred to in regulations 92 and 94.

(4) On receipt of the licence information of the motor vehicle as referred to in subregulation (2), the registering authority must license the motor vehicle in the manner contemplated in regulation 32(2).”.
